

A council was immediately held to receive the report, and Mr. Thompson, the surgeon, intimating the possibility of a passage towards the north shore, which the wind and weather had prevented them from approaching sufficiently near, in the late expedition; it was agreed that another attempt should be made, and that no probable communication should be left unexplored. Accordingly, Captain Ellis, attended by the surgeon, and a few more, set out in the Resolution, to obtain satisfaction on this point. In their passage they law many whales and seals; but soon sound themselves embayed by the coast and islands, and were convinced that no navigable opening existed. Again frustrated in their expectations, they returned to the ships, after no more than one days absence. On the 15th of August, they left Douglas Harbour; and in the Narrows, entering the Wager, were detained by a flood tide for several hours.
